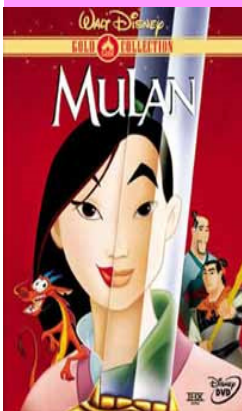


MULAN

Katharine Hepburn, Spencer Tracy, William Bendix

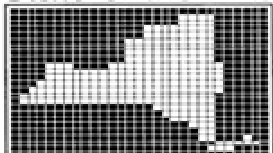
Directed by George Stevens; B&W; Not Rated; 114 minutes; 1942
